Summary of Legislation

Under current law, Cesar Chavez Day is a legal state holiday on March 31 each year that may be voluntarily observed. The bill changes the name of Cesar Chavez Day to Farm Workers Day.

Assessment of No Fiscal Impact

While state agencies and local governments may be required to update references to this state holiday in their employee policies and other materials, the bill does not change the date of the holiday or the total number of days per year that government employees may take off from work. Thus, the bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact on state and local government.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
