CONCERNING A SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF
TRANSPORTATION.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

**SECTION 1. Appropriation to the department of transportation
for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025.** In Session Laws of Colorado
2025, section 2 of chapter 476, (SB 25-206), **amend** Part XXII as follows:


