Summary of Legislation

[Senate Bill 26-016](#), which was signed by the Governor on March 30, 2026, and takes effect on August 12, 2027, assuming no referendum petition is filed, prohibits a person from discharging preproduction plastic materials through land application at a location that does not meet specific requirements. This bill repeals the prohibition and instead restricts a person from disposing preproduction plastic at a location that has not been issued a certificate of designation as a solid wastes disposal site.

Assessment of No Fiscal Impact

The bill makes technical changes to legislation that was enacted this session. Therefore, there is no change to state or local government revenue or expenditures and the bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

Effective Date

The bill takes August 12, 2027, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
