A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING FUNDING TO SUSTAIN THE FIREFIGHTER BEHAVIORAL**
102 **HEALTH BENEFITS PROGRAM.**

Bill Summary

The bill allows the division of fire prevention and control to seek, accept, and expend gifts, grants, or donations to implement the requirements of the firefighter behavioral health benefits program.

1 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 29-5-502, **add** (4) as
2 follows:

3 **29-5-502. Required program - reimbursement.**

4 (4) THE DIVISION OF FIRE PREVENTION AND CONTROL MAY SEEK,
5 ACCEPT, AND EXPEND GIFTS, GRANTS, OR DONATIONS FROM PRIVATE OR
6 PUBLIC SOURCES TO IMPLEMENT THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION.

7 **SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date.** This act
8 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
9 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
10 12, 2026, if adjournment sine die is on May 13, 2026); except that, if a
11 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
12 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
13 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect
14 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
15 November 2026 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
16 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
